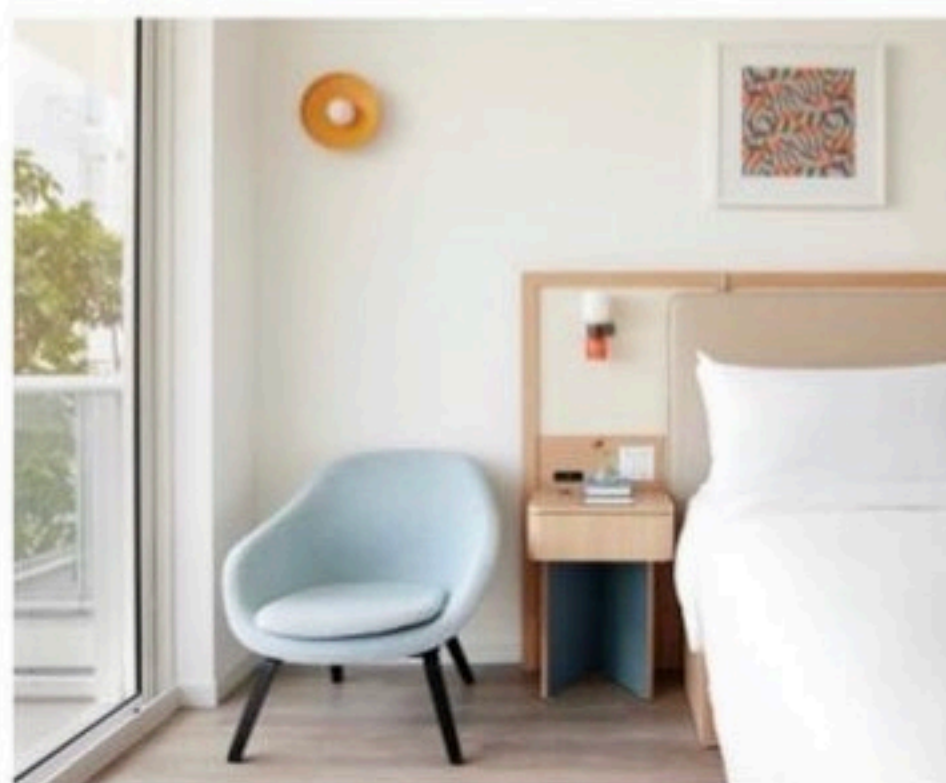
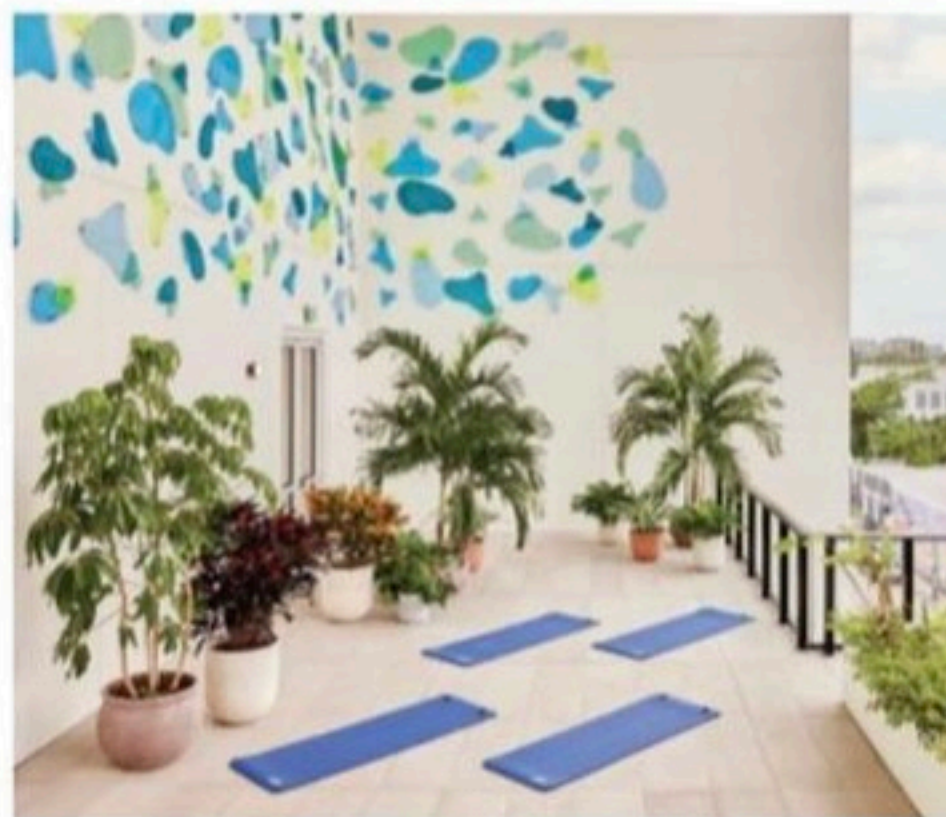

HEAVENS

It's no secret that Wynwood is an art haven, but for the first time, art enthusiasts can spend the night in the neighborhood dotted with murals and graffiti by world-renowned artists.

With its industrial good looks, the new 217-room **Arlo Wynwood** hotel is reflective of the surrounding neighborhood with art at every turn. Featuring more than 250 permanent works from a range of artists including contemporary artist Ryan Coleman, whose laser-cut acrylic sculptures are sprinkled throughout the lobby, and collage artist Ari Robinson's plexiglass mural of spheres in colorful shades of blue, green, and yellow can be found on the third-floor yoga deck. The hotel's exterior walls are just as spectacular: Miami-based artist Hoxhoh created a 140-foot abstract mural stretching over the entire north façade, and Milagros Collective co-founders Felici Asteinza and Joey Fillastre's "Bermuda Triangle" mural—which draws inspiration from the artists and people in the community—dances across the hotel's south staircase and its composition changes as you approach the building.

During Art Week, fine artist Brooke Einbender, aka Mindbender Art, who is a pioneer of "phygital" (physical and digital) art, will showcase "The Unknown Zone" experience at the hotel.



Wander the property to discover elevator doors wrapped in her original mandala designs, as well as reclaimed doors that feel like portals into otherworldly dreamscapes thanks to digital videos and light shows.

"We're creating an art-forward haven for our guests and neighbors where they're immersed in Wynwood's creativity, but also feel enveloped in form, function, and comfort. Whether you're staying with us overnight, joining us for dinner, or taking an important meeting in our communal spaces, curated artwork and thoughtful design inspire at every turn," says Jennifer Hiblum, general manager of Arlo Wynwood.

Escape to Arlo's rooftop pool for epic 360-degree views of the city, ideal for catching the sunrise over Biscayne Bay or sunset in the west. Head to the highly anticipated MaryGolds restaurant—a collab between one of Miami's best chefs, Brad Kilgore, and Bar Lab—where they've crafted a Florida-inspired brasserie that's refined yet with food that's for every taste.

While the Magic City explodes with public art, pop-up projects, installations, activations and fairs, art-goers can find quiet respite and creative inspiration at the Arlo Wynwood, the bustling neighborhood's first hotel.
